Selection of the best procedure for obtaining a liver biopsy depends on numerous factors, including liver size, presence of coagulopathy, diffuse versus focal hepatic lesions, presence of biliary tract obstruction, presence of other intra-abdominal abnormalities, likelihood of surgical resection of a mass, tolerance of general anesthesia, available equipment, and expertise of the clinician.
